3. TRANSPORT TO BRUSSELS

By Train:

At Zaventem station, take a train heading to Brussels. Make sure to board a high-speed train (Thalys or Eurostar) or a regional train (InterCity) towards Brussels. Disembark at one of the main Brussels stations, such as Brussels-Central, Brussels-Midi or Brussels-North. The journey typically takes between 25 and 35 minutes on a high-speed train.

Take the E19 highway from Zaventem towards Brussels. The car journey takes approximately 25 minutes depending on traffic conditions. Be mindful of potential traffic jams.

Call this number to book a taxi or use an online taxi booking application if available. Taxis can pick you up from your current location at the airport and take you to your destination in Brussels

<u>Shuttle bus Brussels-Antwerp:</u>

A shuttle service <u>Brussels- the Havenhuis -Brussels</u> will be available for journeys between Brussels and Antwerp on the 10th of April 2024 to attend the U-space event. Details regarding schedules and departure points will be communicated later. TIME 70NF

<u>Time Zone:</u> Belgium is located in the Central European Time (CET) zone during standard time and Central European Summer Time (CEST) during daylight saving time. CET is UTC+1, and CEST is UTC+2.

<u>Daylight Saving Time:</u> Belgium observes daylight saving time, typically starting on the last Sunday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October. During this period, time is advanced by one hour.

4. CURRENCY AND CREDIT CARDS

Currency: The currency used in Belgium is the euro (€).

<u>Credit/Debit Cards:</u> Credit and debit cards are widely accepted in most shops, restaurants, and hotels. Major cards like Visa, MasterCard, and sometimes American Express are generally accepted. It may be helpful to have some cash, especially in less touristic areas.

<u>Contactless Payment:</u> Contactless payment is common in Belgium. Most merchants accept contactless payments for amounts below a certain limit. Ensure you activate this feature on your cards if not already done.

In summary, the euro is the currency used, credit/debit cards are widely accepted, and contactless payment is common. Having some cash may be useful, but most transactions can be done with cards.

5. ELECTRICITY

<u>Type of Outlet</u>: Electrical outlets are of type C and E. Bring an adapter if needed.

<u>Voltage:</u> The standard voltage is 230V. Ensure your devices are compatible or use a converter if necessary.

Make sure you have the right adapter for the outlets and check the voltage compatibility of your devices. This should be sufficient for safe use of electricity in Brussels.

6. USEFUL PHONE NUMBERS

<u>General emergency number</u>: The emergency number in Belgium is **112**. It can be dialed for free from any phone (landline or mobile) to seek assistance in case of a medical emergency, fire, police or other serious situations.

<u>Emergency medical services</u>: In case of a medical emergency, the number **112** is also the most appropriate.

<u>Local Police</u>: The local police number depends on the region where you are in Belgium. Each region has its own contact number for the police. For example, in Brussels, the contact number is **101**.

7. PASSPORT AND ID CARD

<u>Passport or ID card</u>: Although you do not need a visa, it is essential to travel with a valid passport or ID card. Ensure that your identification document is valid for the entire duration of your stay.
